## Lendlease volunteers with local groups for annual Community Day

**Sydney, 14 September 2017:** Glenmore Park High School is one of 140 worthwhile causes receiving a helping hand from Lendlease employees today, as part of its annual Community Day.

Every year Lendlease employees across Australia, Americas, Asia and Europe volunteer alongside their colleagues, community partners, family and suppliers to make a difference in the communities where they live and work.

Today around 50 Lendlease employees took part in a community project at Glenmore Park to help refresh some of the school's amenities. The work included painting classrooms, installing new bench seating and cabinetry, and gardening.

Glenmore Park High School is one of four schools where Lendlease delivers the Young Indigenous Pathways Program.

The Young Indigenous Pathways program is designed to enable young Aboriginal people in Western Sydney to complete high school, make positive lifestyle choices, develop career aspirations and support the transition of students into skilled training and employment.

Lendlease delivers this program in partnership with the Greater Western Sydney Giants (AFL Club) and the National Aboriginal Sporting Chance Academy (NASCA). Since it started in 2013, the program has had 78 previous participants, with a further 58 students currently enrolled in 2017.

CEO, Engineering & Services, Craig Laslett said Community Day offers employees a chance to apply their experience and skills and make a meaningful and positive contribution to our local communities.

"Community Day has become a great part of our history and culture. Since it started in 1996, we have supported activities ranging from aiding disaster recovery efforts, renovating buildings for those struggling with homelessness or domestic violence, and assisting children with special needs.

"It's great that we are partnering with Glenmore Park High School this year and further building on the success of the Young Indigenous Pathways Program."

Community Day projects are sourced and initiated by Lendlease employees, giving them the ability to choose where they want to lend a hand and where they can be most helpful. This reinforces Lendlease's strong partnerships with the community.

Last year more than 5,000 Lendlease employees participated in Community Day across Australia, the United States, Europe and Asia.
